
In the coming year, we plan to expand and launch targeted literacy, career, and skill development programs for underserved youth.

Empowering young people at every stage of their journey.



ROADS TO SUCCESS AFTER-SCHOOL

Pre-K – Grade 8

Our after-school programs empower students to apply their learning in real-world settings. From mastering STEAM concepts and presenting innovative projects at community events like science fairs, to designing renewable energy solutions and conducting year-long studies on local water quality, our students gain hands-on experience and confidence. This year, RTS youth competed in citywide basketball and volleyball leagues, organized school sports events like the Spring Olympics, and explored sports management and analytics. In the arts, students created large-scale installations, performed in musicals, and built portfolios showcasing their creative talents.



ROADS TO SUCCESS COMMUNITY SCHOOL

Pre-K - Grade 8

RTS Community School in East Harlem stands as a beacon in underserved areas, dismantling barriers to education. Through comprehensive offerings in counseling, after-school programs, and restorative justice, we prioritize family engagement, wellness, academics, and leadership, empowering students and fostering systemic change. RTS Community School is funded by the New York City Department of Education and tailored to meet the needs of the East Harlem Community.



RECESS PROGRAM

Pre-K - Grade 5

Our recess programs for elementary and middle school students prioritize physical fitness and social skills. Through a blend of structured activities and free play, we create an inclusive environment where students thrive in sports, creative games, and collaborative experiences, emphasizing safety and holistic development.



SUMMER CAMP

Pre-K - Grade 8

RTS Summer Rising Camp Programs provide K-8 students with a dynamic blend of academics and enrichment activities, ensuring a well-rounded summer experience. Mornings focus on academic instruction led by licensed teachers, while afternoons are for engaging field trips, arts programming, and outdoor recreation led by Roads to Success staff. As part of the NYC Department of Education and DYCD's Summer Rising initiative, our programs create an inclusive, stimulating environment where students continue to learn, explore, and grow beyond the school year.



COLLEGE AND CAREER EXPLORATION PROGRAMS

Grade 6 - 12

This year, the College Access Pathways program equipped middle and high school students with essential guidance on postsecondary education, career pathways, and financial literacy. Serving hundreds of students across New Design Middle School and PS/MS 57, the program provided hands-on learning experiences through college visits to institutions like Fordham University, Kingsborough Community College, Queens College, and Columbia University. Participation exceeded expectations, with 65 to 70 students attending each trip. Parental engagement was a key focus, with over 80% of parents participating in workshops designed to support their children's academic and career aspirations.



WORKFORCE READINESS

Ages 14 - 24

Our Workforce Readiness programs empowered over 1000+ youth through community-based initiatives and school partnerships, equipping them with essential career and life skills. Across New York City, 600+ younger and older youth participated in our community-based programs, while partnerships with schools such as Bronx Envision Academy, Explorations Academy H.S., and Gramercy Arts High School provided targeted career readiness support."

Students engaged in individual and group counseling, receiving tailored support through SEL lessons, motivational interviewing, and cognitive behavioral strategies. Our sessions offered a safe space for high-risk students, while recess and after-school programs reinforced social-emotional development. Anti-bullying initiatives fostered a positive school climate, and student recognition events, such as honor roll ceremonies, celebrated academic and personal achievements.

Year in Review

SEPTEMBER 1, 2023 to JUNE 30, 2024

This year, RTS empowered youth across NYC to lead, learn, and thrive. From policy advocacy to personal growth, each moment sparked change and built brighter futures.

CIVIC ENGAGEMENT & COMMUNITY SERVICE

SPREADING HOLIDAY CHEER

In December, RTS helped bring holiday joy to more than 150 families in East Harlem through a toy and food distribution event. In partnership with local community organizations and donors, students received gifts including electronics, books, and games, while families were provided with holiday meals and essential items.



HONORING DR. KING THROUGH SERVICE

In honor of Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Roads to Success partnered with a Bronx-based food assistance organization to prepare and distribute over 600 meals. Volunteers contributed their time and energy to serve neighbors in need, promoting Dr. King's message of justice and service.



AMPLIFYING YOUTH VOICES IN ALBANY

In February, 30 high school students from the Bronx and Manhattan traveled to Albany to participate in the New York State Black, Puerto Rican, Hispanic, and Asian Legislative Conference. Students met with elected officials to advocate for increased educational resources, solutions to gun violence, and expanded youth employment opportunities. For many, it was their first experience engaging in the civic process.

CAREER READINESS & WORKFORCE EXPOSURE

DATAIKU OFFICE VISIT (NOV 2023)

Youth explored careers in artificial intelligence and machine learning, gaining exposure to real-world applications in the tech industry.

TOMORROW'S LEADERS CONFERENCE (FEB 2024)

Students attended leadership workshops, heard from inspiring speakers, and explored strategies for civic engagement.

FORDHAM UNIVERSITY VISIT (MAR 2024)

Nearly 100 middle school students participated in a campus tour and financial literacy workshop, receiving fee waivers for future applications.



ADVANTAGE CAPITAL CAREER DAY (FEB 2024)

47 youth participated in sessions focused on resume building, communication skills, and professional development.

DELOITTE IMPACT DAY (FEB 2024)

Over 80 youth explored pathways to success through activities focused on personal branding, resilience, and goal-setting.



CAREER & COLLEGE AWARENESS WEEK (MAR 2024)

Held at New Design Middle School, students engaged in games, performances, and interactive workshops promoting future pathways.






